STATEMENT OF PURPOSES

The purposes of the Ormond Amateur Football Club Incorporated are:

1. As a member of the Victorian Amateur Football Association (and/or any successor association/league), to encourage, promote, foster and develop participation in Australian Rules football, particularly in Ormond and the surrounding region.
2. To work with and support the Ormond Junior Football Club (OJFC) in its Auskick and junior football (Under 8-17) endeavors, and to provide a pathway for OJFC players into senior football.
3. Together with the OJFC, to generate a club and community environment (including the provision of suitable amenities and facilities) in which members, supporters and residents can freely participate and which supports a sense of belonging for all those involved.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

What was an initial commitment of five years as President of the Ormond Amateur Football Club has extended to nine years, and every season has been a privilege and honour to serve the Club.

The 2022 Season was a return to some normality following the two previous seasons significantly interrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic, and this was a relief to all. However, the Seniors and Reserves players, coaches and staff had to negotiate an unusually long 22-week season (20 matches, 2 byes). This was due to an inexplicable decision by the VAFA Board in November 2021 to relegate the Parkdale Vultures from Premier B to Premiers C after successfully pleading their case of sustained hardship in Premier B during previous seasons. This resulted in the disappointing outcome of 11 clubs doing battle in Premier C, and leaving 9 clubs remaining in Premier B. As I have said on a number of occasions this season, I thank all Senior and Reserves players, coaches and staff who displayed much resolve and resilience to endure the additional four weeks of training and matches during this extended season.

Whilst none of the four teams experienced finals football this season, it was nevertheless a season that still provided its share of highlights, successes and celebrations – here are a few:

- Damien Cleary's 400th game for Ormond on 29 July, under lights @ The Gunn.
- Ormond's 1st Senior Night Game against Hampton Rovers on 10 June, which drew an estimated 600 spectators to see Ormond prevail by 10 points, despite being underdogs.
- The Thirds after-the-siren victory against Prahran Assumption under lights on 24 June, when U19 player, Jacob Whiting, kicked accurately for a 4 point victory.
- The Senior team setting a Club-high Premier C score of 30.17-197 against Preston on 18 June, and just missing the all-time highest score by only 15 points!
- Matt Oaten's after-the-siren goal to claim victory against Marcellin in the last match of 2022, which was also his 200th Club game.
- Penny Cula-Reid's appointment as the Director of Female Football across both the Ormond AFC and the Ormond Junior Football Club.



It was terrific to have the U19s team turn out again in 2022, the second year back following no teams in 2019 and 2020. Despite exceptional coaching and mentoring from 1st year Coach, Ravi Presser, and unquestionable endeavor from all players, the team had a challenging season finishing in 10th position with 5 wins and 13 losses. The Thirds also had a season of hardships, mainly due to its frequent ‘player drain’ to cover-off injuries and unavailability in the Reserves. Greg Maclaren was an outstanding coach – understanding, supportive, and encouraging, as were the core group of Thirds players; the team finished 7th with 1 win, 8 losses, 1 forfeit for, and 4 forfeited matches.



As mentioned, the Seniors and Reserves had an extended season of 20 matches each, and regular injuries across both teams (some season-ending) curtailed their competitiveness during the middle and concluding stages of the season. Senior Coach, Greg ‘Reggie’ Hoskin (left), had his first full season of coaching since being appointed in November 2019, and was fantastic albeit under challenging circumstances. The player turnover can be so clearly illustrated with one statistic – no less than 18 players debuted! In the end, to finish in 7th position (10 wins, 10 losses) and only 2 games adrift of the Four was an exceptional result. Club and VAFA

stalwart, Russell Barnes, again coached the Reserves in 2022, and like Greg with the Thirds had a team that continually had to make available players to the Seniors due to injury and suspensions. The Reserves finished in 8th position with 6 wins, 13 losses and 1 forfeit for, but was less than a kick away from victory on a number of occasions. Barney announced his retirement from coaching just prior to the last round and brought down the curtain on an outstanding career of service to Ormond and the VAFA, as both a player and a coach. It was fitting that Barney was presented with a VAFA Certificate of Merit for his services to Ormond, the VAFA’s highest honour it can bestow on club personnel and volunteers (see later report on Barney’s career).

In the past couple of months, I have announced the re-appointment of Reggie as Senior Coach, Greg as the Thirds Coach, and Ravi as the U19s coach. I was also pleased to announce two Assistant Senior Coaches – Simon Andrews and Oscar Persson – who will provide much needed support to Reggie in 2023. I also welcome Rob Grey, the Club’s new fitness supervisor appointed in October, which will enable Paul ‘PK’ Kennedy to transition into injury rehabilitation and managing player high performance.

Season 2022 also saw the passing of three highly valued people in the Ormond AFC “community”: Bruce Ritchie, Life Member, past committee member and Club handyman for 40 years (and followed Judy’s passing in December 2021); Stephen Keleher (right), former committee member and much-loved former coach and raconteur of the Monders; and Steven Jackson, former player and past committee member, and a tremendously loyal and jovial match day supporter for five decades. Sadly, these three men are amongst several outstanding Club contributors and supporters who have passed away in the past 12 months (see later report).



An extraordinary personal milestone was achieved this season when Damien ‘Pistons’ Cleary played his 400th club match on 29 July - it was a night game @ The Gunn to remember! In the following pages there is more on Pistons and his remarkable service to the Club. At the other end of the spectrum, congratulations to 18 players who debuted as Senior players in 2022: Leon Alao, James Tsakonas, Sean Gunning, Connor Delaney, Max Bailey, Lucca Beaves, Raage Noor, Tom Fogarty, Kai Seeto-Grossi, Rhys Kennedy, Joshua Levine, Caleb Myers, Ulysses Urban, Aidan Soria, Dylan Smith, Liam Gordon-Shore, Luke Kennedy, Liam Adlington and Angus Grey.



Some other well-deserved milestones and awards were a feature of the 2022 Season, beginning with David Machin, Sam Ashton and Matt Oaten (left) celebrating their 200th games. Congratulations also to other players who celebrated major milestones during the season: 150 games – Tim Blackburn, Henry Simon; 100 games – Travis Hine, Will Sayce, Michael Jukes. Will McCartney won the Barnes Family Medal after being adjudged the best afield in the Ormond v Hampton Rovers night match. In August at the Past & Present Players Function, the Club celebrated the careers of seven past players who played 150 games or more with Ormond, and are recently retired (Lloyd Anrep, Andrew Clinch, Luke Duthie, Dan Frazier, Orry Lack, Matthew Martinov and Boyd Upstill). Each player had a plaque unveiled in the change room, commemorating their games’ achievement and duration. 2022 was the 50th anniversary of Ormond’s 1972 A Grade premiership, and a big thank you to Bruce Bourne who organised the reunion of 15 premiership players at the August President’s Lunch. And I take this opportunity to acknowledge the valuable contribution of Club historian, Alan Naylor, who researched player backgrounds, grand final details, and other highlights for the reunion, and also for providing player backgrounds for obituaries posted this season.

Sincere congratulations to Geoff Woodford, Lachlan Upstill, David Machin and Leo Dalton on being awarded Life Membership of the Ormond AFC this year – all having given outstanding service to the Club over many years, and in all cases still doing so (see later report). Well done to all Best & Fairest winners and placegetters, and other season award recipients (see later reports).

I have previously acknowledged the season Head coaches, but assisting them was Jason Burt with the Seniors, Paul & Mark McDonald and Guy Ritchie with the Reserves, Dave Machin with the Thirds, and Max Tucker with the U19s. A strong group of on-field leaders were appointed: Club Captain, Tom Buckley (right) was supported by the senior leadership group of Matt Oaten, Sam Mason, BJ Hardwick, Harrison Burt and Dae Szydluk; Caleb Myers (Reserves Captain); Chris Roach (Thirds Captain), and supported by deputies Matt Horrigan,





Hugh Conron and Scott Walker; and Fraser Sharman-Smith (U19 Captain) and supported by deputies Aidan Soria and Kai Seeto-Grossi. Jason Burt has been Director of Football since late 2018 and continued his positive influence on the Club's football operations. PK's contribution to player strength & conditioning and rehabilitation was again first-class, and I thank Brad Cathie who supported PK this season.

I was fortunate to have a hard working Executive and General Committee this season, and I thank them for their time and efforts. The Committee was Stephen Manning (Secretary), Tim Naylor (Treasurer), Greg Holman (Vice-President Football Operations), Tim Ashford (Vice-President Marketing), Greg Hammond (Vice-President Culture & Social), Damien Cleary (Assistant Secretary), and general committee members, Gary Murray, Tim Harkin, and Chris Roach. The Committee continues to use the Club's **2020-2024 Strategic Plan *BROWN AND BLUE Believe, Belong*** as its guiding framework. The Committee's 2022 scorecard against the strategic plan objectives is shown in Attachment 1 to this Annual Report. A special mention and thanks to **Tim Ashford** who oversaw a significant improvement (again!) in sponsorship revenue this season, and who continues to generate additional income through fundraisers with the support of **Greg Hammond**.

Many staff and volunteers contribute week in and week out to ensure all matches are conducted as smoothly as possible. **Greg Holman** was again superb with his overall coordination of match day activities and general support for the players and coaches, including coordinating the trainers. **Chris Seville** and **George Antoniou** from Healthy Bodies Physiotherapy provided vital medical support on Saturdays to the Senior team, and recovery and rehabilitation services to all players during the week. **Gary Murray** and **Tim Harkin** (right) once again looked after all team management duties for the Seniors and Reserves. In addition, Bomber cooked many Thursday night meals and line-marked the oval. **Damien Cleary** fulfilled team manager duties for the Thirds, and **Mark Beaves, Lucca Beaves, Sam Reynolds, Lyndon Loader** and **Michelle Grierson** shared support to the Under 19s during the season. **Jack Keleher** and **Mick Cahalane** recorded match statistics for the Seniors and Reserves, respectively, and **Zach Hanson** (Senior runner), **Stewart McCooke & Greg Hammond** (Reserves runner), and **Max Tucker** (U19 runners), rounded out the direct support to coaches and players.



Steve Aarons was the Club's tireless and incredibly committed Reserves/ Thirds field umpire and was rightfully recognised as the 2022 Club Person of the Year. **Pistons** also assisted with some umpiring duties. We were fortunate to have fantastic support from a band of U16 & U17 boys to assist with water and boundary umpiring duties across the Reserves, Thirds and Under 19s, thank you so much **Aiden Jobling, Kane Vaughan, Tarkyn Isaacs** and **Luke Kennedy** (all pictured).



Michael Oaten and **Malcom Roach** regularly fulfilled the role of Reserves goal umpire. **Geoff Woodford** continued his service as Senior and Reserves timekeeper and scoreboard operator. Big thanks to the above for undertaking critical roles each match – roles that ensure the game can be played.

Other volunteers who worked tirelessly behind the scenes during Season 2022 included the following: **Leo Dalton** as the Club photographer and website manager (the latter with assistance from **Mick Cahalane**), **David Symes** and **Jarred Harry** assisted with pavilion maintenance, and **Steve Aarons** regularly assisted **Steve Manning** in the Bar. **Pamela Simon** was outstanding in her many support roles to me, but particularly in her coordination of ‘kitchen hands’ on Thursday nights to prepare the players’ meals, coordinating the Canteen roster and also manning the Canteen counter at times, and assisting me with the set-up of the President’s Lunches. Chris Roach put together an outstanding power point presentation for the Season Presentation Function, and **Pistons** continued to conduct the twice weekly raffle (Thursday nights, Saturdays post-match) raising important funds for the Club. Big thanks to **Shane and Cheryl Metz** for preparing the colourful and effective posters and flyers for social events and luncheons, **David Symes** for coordinating the bookings and tables for the President’s Lunches, and **Marg Putz** who donated gift packs to raffle.

There was a large band of supporters who volunteered to help Pamela Simon with Thursday night meals and with the Canteen, including Jane Fitzmaurice, Kim & Rod Sharman-Smith, Robyn & Geoff Mason, Michelle Grierson, James Robertshaw, Tony Nathan, Mandy King, Mandy Davis, Christine Hine, Pam Oaten, Cameron van Oosten, Danielle Hardwick, Jodie & Lola Bingham, Greg Holman, Kerrie-Ann Buckley, Lex Copley, and Gill Quinn. Functions and fundraising continue to be important and enjoyable components to our seasons:

- Two instalments of the Friday **Fifth Day Lunch** were held this year at the McKinnon Hotel and were again a success in their sixth year. **Alan Naylor** is the coordinator of the lunches that featured former Ormond player and Australian cricketer, Rob Quiney (May Lunch), and former flamboyant North Melbourne premiership player and now Lamb Ambassador, Sam Kekovich (October Lunch). These continue to be great opportunities for past players and supporters to come together, as well as raising some important revenue.
- The Club staged its first ever **Friday Night Match** for points on 10 June in a blockbuster against local rival, Hampton Rovers, and drew an estimated 600 spectators. The Monders victors by 10 points.
- The **Past & Present Players Function** (organised by Greg Hammond) attracted 50 guests to celebrate the seven new 150 game retirees, and to provide an opportunity for past and current players to meet and mix.

- **Gary Murray** organised a successful and valuable **\$3,000 Reverse Draw**.

This year the Auction was conducted in partnership with the Ormond Junior Football Club and generated over \$10,000 for the Club. The success of the auction was wholly due to the generous donations from many, with a particular shout-out to Aaron Holman, Greg Hammond, ‘Digs’ Keleher, Pulse8, Big Dogg, Melbourne Racing Club Foundation, Ace Gutters, and Coolabah Turf.
- Congratulations to Shane Metz and Paul Dixon on winning the **Ormond AFC Annual Golf Tournament** played at Southern Golf Club on 13 May.

The Club, in partnership with the Ormond Junior Football Club and the Ormond Cricket Club, was able to update the Club's TVs and audio systems. Another joint project with the junior club was the updating of the chairs, couches and cutlery, made possible from the closure and sale of the Bentleigh Club. **Gary Murray** and **Mike Whitney** coordinated the collection of equipment, and Club sponsor, **Matt Stahmer** (Stahmer Carpets) donated the use of one of his vans.

The players and Club once again supported community and social awareness initiatives during 2022. On the 25 June, the Seniors and Reserves joined the Mazenod teams by wearing coloured socks to raise awareness of Rainbow Week/ LGBTQI community, and the importance of inclusion and acceptance of all people no matter their gender identity. The Ormond AFC continues to have an excellent relationship with our co-tenant, the Ormond Cricket Club, and I congratulate 2022 President, Will Robertshaw, on the continued success and growth of cricket at EE Gunn Reserve.

In closing, I acknowledge the wonderful support that the Club receives from the Ormond AFC Life Members Association (thank you 2021/22 President, Reine Anrep), the City of Glen Eira (Sports Liaison Officer, Emily Beventyre), the VFA administration, our local State MP, David Southwick Member for Caulfield, and former Federal MP, Tim Wilson Member for Goldstein. The Ormond AFC Life Members Association donated \$2,000 to the Club. The Council continues to ensure the playing surface, the pavilion, and other associated infrastructure are maintained to a high standard, and provides other support to the Club. David and Tim continue to be a loyal and generous supporters of the Club.

For the Club to continue to be a competitive force in Premier C in 2023, and eye promotion into Premier B, all players, committee, officials, volunteers, sponsors, and supporters need to raise their intensity and involvement. The Committee will continue to have a lens on improving the Club's sustainability and its competitiveness in the local sporting landscape.

Finally, I wish all involved with the Ormond Amateur Football Club a very safe and happy Christmas and New Year period, and look forward to welcoming everyone back into the fold on 15 April 2023 for Round 1.

400 GAMES DAMIEN 'PISTONS' CLEARY

It is an extraordinary feat for any footballer to achieve the 400 game milestone on Friday 29 July 2022 under lights **DAMIEN CLEARY** ran out for the 400th time for the Ormond Amateur Football Club.

Pistons began playing for Ormond in 1995, and since that time has played 39 Senior games, 190 Reserves games and 170 Thirds games. Along the way he has enjoyed team and individual success: a Reserves premiership in 1998; and Reserves B&Fs in 1996 and 1999.

His contribution to Ormond off-field is just as outstanding as the on-field milestone: a Committee member since 2004, including 3 years as Secretary (2011-2013) and the balance as Assistant Secretary & Registrar; occasional Club field umpire, boundary umpire and goal umpire when the need has arisen to fill a gap; raffle ticket seller on Thursday nights and Senior home games 1998-2001 & 2003-present for an estimated \$50,000 in ticket sales; and current Secretary of the O AFC' Life Members Association.

Pistons' service to the Club has been recognised on many occasions, including Life Membership (2005); Club Person of the Year (2017); and VAFA Certificate of Merit (2019). The 400 game milestone becomes the current Ormond AFC games record, a record that has been re-set for each match Pistons has played since breaking the previous record of 366 games in Round 3 2019.

Congratulations Pistons from everyone at the Ormond AFC, and the broader football community, on reaching this milestone - a remarkable example of personal achievement and Club contribution all in one.



RUSSELL BARNES RETIRES

After nearly 40 years and active involvement in 692 matches of Amateur football, **RUSSELL BARNES** announced his retirement as a player and coach at the conclusion of Season 2022. It has been an extraordinary and unique career that has included multiple premierships as a player and a coach, Big V representative football, and a host of other off-field roles with the six clubs he has been involved with.

Barney is an Ormond (and VAFA) legend. He played 255 games for Ormond, including four Premier A premierships - three as Captain (1985, 1987, 1988) - was selected as a Big V player on 11 occasions, and was inducted as a Big V 'Champion' in the VAFA Hall of Fame in 2017. He also coached Ormond Seniors for two seasons (2008, 2009), including the Premier C premiership in 2008, and for the past three seasons has been the Ormond Reserves coach (2020-2022).

Other clubs that Barney has coached include Old Brighton, Hampton Rovers, St Bedes/Mentone, Beaumaris and Aquinas, and his legacy at all of these clubs is his mentoring of coaching assistants, his passion for amateur football, and his friendships.

We are fortunate that Barney calls Ormond 'home', as in his own words, "*If I bleed, I bleed brown and blue*". What a distinguished career, a memorable career, a successful career. He ended the season having coached Ormond in 73 matches, and with his 255 games played, Barney's club games total is 328 matches.

All Ormond past and present players and supporters congratulate you Barney and thank you, but all amateur people also thank you and wish you good luck in your footy-free days! It is also necessary to acknowledge the unconditional support Barney has received from his family during his career: wife, Jude, and children Michael, John and Jane (deceased).

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT

2022 provided us with our first full season in three years. Due to decisions at the VAFA Board, Premier C was made up of 11 teams resulting in two additional byes and a very long 22 round season.



We were fortunate to be able to retain three of our coaches from 2021, Greg Hoskin (Seniors), Russell Barnes (Reserves) and Greg Maclaren (Thirds). Max Bailey was not able to continue as U/19 coach and we thank him for the great work he did in re-establishing a strong and committed U/19 playing group, most of whom returned for this season. We were extremely fortunate to appoint Ravi Presser (ex-player and Senior Runner) to the coaching position (left).

I congratulate all four coaches and Jason Burt, Director of Football, for the outstanding work they did in developing, supporting and managing the teams and individual players by working so cooperatively. I would also like to recognise the work the assistant coaches / support staff did during the year: Matt Suckling, Oscar Persson, Paul McDonald, Mark McDonald, Guy Ritchie, Max Tucker and David Machin.

A number of Senior players from 2021 either retired, moved interstate or to other clubs. We lost established Senior players Simon Buckley, Max Kennedy, Jackson Hille, Tim Allan and Steve Tolongs before the season commenced, and Matt Suckling (right) moved interstate early in the season. Other players incurred season-ending and or long-term injuries during the season thereby depleting our playing numbers, including Ethan Hanley, Leon Alao, Zac Hanson, and Caleb Myers, and our prized recruit, Connor Delaney, went down with an ACL in Round 1.



The loss of such high calibre players was going to test our depth while providing opportunities for other players to experience Senior level football. As we know this type of situation provides an opportunity for younger players at the Club and/or new players to step up. This was definitely the case with U/19 players, such as Rhys Kennedy, James Tsakonas, Kai Seeto-Grossi (right), Liam Gordon-Shore, Aiden Soria, Leon Alao, Raage Noor and Joe Nowell making their Senior debuts. We also had Luke Kennedy become the second youngest player in Club's history to make his Senior debut (still eligible for U/16 football) and Josh Lavine from the U/17's. They joined Will McCartney who was already playing in the Seniors as an U/19.



We had the largest number of players making their Senior debut that I can remember with 19 players achieving this honour. Injuries and unavailability from week to week meant there were multiple changes across all four sides. This is highlighted in the fact that we played 64 players in the Reserve team this year. It is noted our Thirds Captain for the season, Chris Roach, played every game bar one in the Reserves. We also had U/19 players supporting both the Reserves and the Thirds from week to week, which we very

much appreciated. It reflects the work the coaches and the players leadership group did to have the U/19 players, and all the new players, feel comfortable and accepted by the Senior players and the Club as a whole.

This season we saw the introduction of night football at the Gunn. The first night game under our new lights was a local derby against Hampton Rovers who were top of the ladder at the time. We were able to knock them off in what was a memorable night for the Club both on and off the ground with the largest crowd we had seen at Ormond for many years. We held two further night games both involving the Thirds. Again, both were very memorable: one ended in a victory with a goal after the siren by Jacob Whiting (right), one of the U/19 players playing on the night; and the second was for Damien ‘Pisto’ Cleary’s 400th game, the first Ormond player to reach this milestone. Well done, Pisto, and I do not think he is finished yet!!!!



It is fair to say we didn’t achieve the results we were hoping for and that we worked so hard to achieve. However I believe the number of players that had the opportunity to experience Senior football, and their development as players due to playing at a higher level, holds us in a very good position for next season and for the years ahead. The final results for the year were:

Seniors – 7th with 10 wins and 10 losses

Reserves – 8th with 7 wins and 13 losses

Thirds – 7th with 2 wins and 10 losses

U/19’s – 10th with 5 wins and 13 losses

We were again fortunate to have an expert team to support the players both on and off the field in their preparation, rehabilitation and medical support. We welcomed Brad Cathie to our rehab team to extend and support the great work PK had been providing. Both PK and Brad attended all training nights and games to provide the support to the players to allow them to perform to the best of their ability, and the coaches to have the best prepared team possible. We were once again this year supported by George, our Physio from Healthy Bodies Physiotherapy (right), and on the few occasions he was not available on game day, Annie Wu joined us as his replacement trainer. George and Annie’s knowledge and expertise ensured players were assessed and treated when injured to maximise their recovery time.



Our trainers did another great job this year. Miriam, Rachel, Kam, Paige (above), Ashray, Annie, Arty, Alanna and Keith were all outstanding in the support and management of the players both at training and on game day. Also a big thank you to Mark Beaves, a father of two of the U/19 players, who filled in as a trainer during the year.

A big thank you to our hard working team managers who did a remarkable job week in and week out ensuring all the Vafa requirements were met and coordinating volunteers



to fill all the necessary roles on match day. Thank you to Bomber, Tim Harkin, Pisto and Ravi and Max who looked after the role along with coaching the U/19s.

Thank you to the runners for the teams. Zac Hanson (right) for the Seniors, Stewart McCooke for the Reserves, and a range of injured players and or assistant coaches for the Thirds and U/19s. Also a big thank you to Geoff Woodford for being so reliable doing the timekeeping for both Reserves and Seniors each week, to Leo Dalton who was at 2 -3 games each weekend taking action shots which are great memories for the players and spectators at these games, and to Jack Keleher for the work he did on taking stats etc. providing important input for coaches on match day. Also to Sam Reynolds (Luke and Tom’s mother) and Michelle Grierson (Miles mother) for helping out the U/19s each week with timekeeping and or goal umpiring. A big thanks to Luke Kennedy, Tarkyn Isaacs, Kane Vaughan and Aiden Jobling for helping out with boundary umpire duties and/or as water carriers on match days.



To the many volunteers who offered to do a role and those who when asked happily completed the duties required, we thank you, as without your help we could not field the four sides we did this year.

Thank you to Russell Barnes for taking responsibility for recording the names of players and officials attending training, and also to Russell, Reggie and Jason for the work they did in analysing the film for the Senior and Reserves games each week and providing relevant and thorough feedback to individual players and the teams as a whole.

We all look forward to the 2023 season and the excitement that it will bring.

TREASURER'S REPORT

2022 needed to be a season of consolidation financially after the enormous efforts to keep the Club in the black throughout the Covid ravaged seasons of 2020 and 2021. The Club was in a strong position financially at the end of last season and the hope was to improve on that position through a continued strategy of increasing revenue and reducing costs where possible.

I am pleased to report that the Club has done just that throughout the course of the 2022 season, and has returned a surplus this season of \$15,004. This is in comparison to a budgeted surplus of \$13,102 when the budget was prepared before the season commenced. Corporate sponsorship increased year on year and beat budget estimates. It must be noted that most 2021 corporate sponsors were again sponsors in 2022 so a big thanks to their continued support. We hope that these sponsors were able to enjoy a return for their dollar a lot more this season in what was, all things considered, a relatively normal football season. This is an area of revenue that is vital to us continuing as a football club so the efforts of Richard Simon and Tim Ashford especially must be commended.

Bar trading and canteen trading returned to the levels they were at in 2019 (pre Covid). Thanks to Stephen Manning, Gary Murray and Richard & Pamela Simon and the many others for their contributions towards running the bar, Thursday night meals, and particularly the organisation of the canteen, week to week.

The Fifth Day Lunches this season have generated a net surplus of close to \$6,000 for the Club. The McKinnon Hotel offered the complimentary use of the function room and associated catering for one of the Fifth Day Lunches as part of their 2022 sponsorship, so all revenue from ticket sales at that event stayed with the Club. Thank you to Alan Naylor for the organisation of these well attended luncheons.

Special thanks must also be made to Tim Harkin (200 Club), Steve Manning and Steve Aarons (bar duties), Damien Cleary, Tim Ashford and Greg Hammond (raffles) and all on the social committee for the well organised functions and fundraisers. All those mentioned have contributed greatly to important revenue raising activities. On behalf of the Committee, I would also like to once again thank the Club's generous financial members and benefactors for their ongoing support this season. Your contributions throughout the season, as always, are very much appreciated by Committee, players, sponsors, volunteers and supporters alike.

Expenditure for the year was to be closely monitored and reduced where possible. For the most part this was achieved throughout the season which helped contribute significantly towards the Club generating a surplus in 2022. This being said, the Committee is well aware of inflationary pressures that we are all facing and we know that the Club is not immune to this.

All in all, a successful season off the field in 2022, which has allowed us to remain in a strong position financially! Something to again build on for 2023 with the hope that our on-field success replicates our continued off-field success. Enjoy the summer and see you all again for Season 2023.
